In addition, we are pleased to report that a comprehensive inventory of the Masonic artifact collection at our Library's Utica site is now complete. With Ratirat Osiri's professional expertise, we were able to fully catalog 70 significant artifacts in the Utica collection.

August marked the departure of Joseph Patzner as the Librarian of the Livingston Masonic Library. Joseph started as our full-time Librarian in 2017, and was a familiar face to all Library patrons. During his tenure as Librarian, Joseph was also instrumental in helping to implement the Odilo e-resources platform for the Library, which has allow patrons to access Masonic books digitally during the Covid-19 pandemic. 

Masonic Artifacts from the Library's Utica Site Now on the Online Museum By Ratirat Osiri, Museum Technician


We are pleased to announce that selections of artifacts from the Library's Utica site at the Utica Masonic Temple are now available on the online Museum.

The new additions include the Masonic relic collection from Central City Lodge No. 305, which is now Fayetteville Central City Lodge, No. 305. In the Central City collection are the first set of lodge officer jewels - dating back to 1850s. Additionally, in the Lodge's collection, is a ballot box.

Another artifact that is available via the online Museum is the 'ammunition' magazine key of USS Maine. In 1898, the USS Maine exploded in Havana harbor in Cuba, which eventually led to the Spanish–American War of 1898. Rear Admiral Charles Dwight Sigsbee, who was captain of the USS Maine at the time, personally presented the magazine key to the New York Masonic Home.

Another treasure trove of Masonic artifacts that are available on the online Museum are the collection of Utica trowels. Many of these trowels were used to lay the cornerstones of the buildings throughout the history of the Masonic Home (Masonic Care Community).



It has been well-over two centuries since the suppression of the Illuminati in Germany, yet they still are the subject of elaborate and sinister conspiracy theories.
